
The following are a series of Afrocentric folktales about a clever little monkey.

Using her quick wit, she tricks the croc into believing her heart is left at home, only to replace it with a juicy mango, saving herself in the process. In another tale, Aria is challenged by a lion cub to a race but cleverly enlists her cousins to confuse the cub, outsmarting her and turning a potential enemy into a playful friend. In her final story, Aria and her father, Baba, help the animals dig a water hole during a drought, while only Aria stays vigilant enough to catch Jackal stealing water at night. Aria and the Lion Cub




